The 3rd IRENA Innovation Week (IVIW2020) will take place online during 5-8 October 2020 under the theme *"Renewable solutions for transport and industry"*. The IRENA Innovation Week series has become a landmark biennial event to discuss the latest innovations that will lead to a global energy transition. The 2016 and 2018 editions focused on the energy supply side, exploring zero-carbon power systems based on integrating highshares of renewables. The third edition of the IRENA Innovation Week will move into the energy demand side by providing important new insights into challenges, opportunities and emerging solutions for end-use energy sector decarbonisation.
